#### **Advent**

We know the Christmas season has arrived when the tree is up and the wreaths are hung on our doors, but do you know the meaning of the wreath that is often displayed in our houses?

The Advent wreath is a Christian tradition that symbolises the passage of the four weeks of Advent, which is the season of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas. It is a circular wreath made of evergreen branches, typically adorned with four candles, and sometimes a fifth, central candle.

The circle shape of the wreath reminds us that God's love has no beginning and no end. The green leaves symbolise the hope of eternal life. When many trees in the Northern hemisphere lose their leaves, evergreens remain green, a reminder of God's enduring love. There are 4 candles (sometimes 5).



The progressive lighting of the candles each week symbolises the increasing anticipation and preparation for the birth of Jesus.

### St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal

The St Vincent DePaul Society provides, food, clothing, living expenses and crisis support for vulnerable people.
