YEAR 6 LEADERS

Congratulations to our leaders for 2024! In week 5, we celebrated our new CRCs, School Ambassadors, Missions Captains and House Captains. Our leaders then enjoyed National Young Leaders Day, where they discovered more about how "leadership is about you making your contribution and together we can shine brightly".

Here's what our leaders had to say about their experience at National Young Leaders Day:

Alisia: What I enjoyed at the Leaders Forum was the chance to meet the Premier of South Australia and listen to his journey to becoming the Premier. At All Saints, we show persistence through both negative and positive experiences. We always need to 'show up'.

Madeleine: On Wednesday, I enjoyed listening to Bryson Klein talk about his life as a Ninja Warrior. Even when things seemed tough, he stood outside his comfort zone and gave things a go. At All Saints, I will step outside my comfort zone and do things that I might have tried to hide from.

Madison: The highlight for me was listening to the Ninja Warrior, Bryson Klein, tell the story about when he was little and climbing the mountain. He got stuck, and his dad was too high up, so he had to face his fears and climb by himself. His dad told him that bravery is not the absence of fear; bravery is to keep trying. At All Saints, bring me back when I doubt myself. I am going to keep crying and not let fear control me.

Tahlia: My favorite thing was listening to the Ninja Warrior guy, Bryson Klein, but I also enjoyed listening and looking at Anastasia Woolmer and knowing how to remember all the numbers. I thought that it was very impressive that she could remember 36 numbers forwards and backwards, as well as remembering them backwards after 20 minutes. I will bring back All Saints by making the correct choices and being a strong role model for my peers.

Tennayah: My favorite part of Leaders Day was when Anastia Woolner showed us her memory trick. She memorized 45 numbers, forward and backward. She did this through lots of practise and making mistakes. At All Saints, I will let them know that practise makes progress.

Bailey: My favorite thing on Wednesday was listening to the Ninja Warrior and author talk about their careers and how they became what they are. I also enjoyed listening to the premier speak, as it was interesting to know that if you are silly when you are younger, you can still become a leader. There is a free community program open for enrolments called the FRIENDS Resilience Program that will be run next term (Term 2, 2024).

The FRIENDS Resilience
Program is a 10-week early
intervention/prevention
program for children aged
between 7-12 years of age. It
uses an evidence-base, FUN
approach through activity
base learning in a group
setting.

Your child will build a tool kit to assist them in developing life skills to effectively cope with difficult and/or anxiety provoking situations and build resilience and problem-solving abilities and a lot more.

We keep the groups small to better support your child's growth. All programs run over the school terms from 3.30pm to 5pm once a week. The program is run in Seaford on Thursdays, Aldinga on Wednesdays and Hackham on Fridays.


